## About the Lecturer

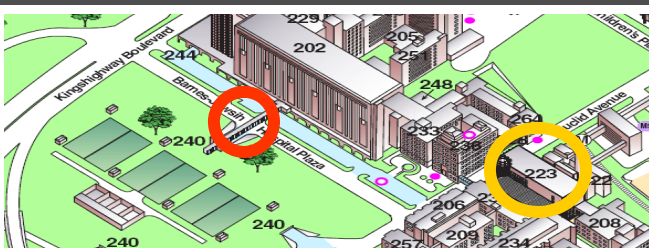
Orien Reid began her broadcasting career in 1972 and is known for her investigative and service news reports. She is recognized for her sensitive examination of issues impacting baby-boomers.

Orien has gained respect for her volunteer work with the Alzheimer’s Association. In 1991, she organized the Alzheimer’s Association of Southeastern Pennsylvania’s first Memory Walk. From 1999-2002, she served as Chairman of the National Board of Directors of the Alzheimer’s Association, and from 2005-2008, she served as chairman of Alzheimer’s Disease International. Her other civic activities include member, National Advisory Council on Aging; advisory board member, National Institutes of Health Council of Councils; member, Philadelphia Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated.

Orien earned her Bachelor of Arts Degree from Clark College and a Masters Degree from the Atlanta University School of Social Work in Atlanta, Georgia. The November 2002 issue of Woman’s Day magazine selected Orien as one of 4 women to receive the national “Women Who Inspire Us” award.
