

Jennifer J. Manly, Ph.D., is an Assistant Professor of Neuropsychology in Neurology at the G.H. Sergievsky Center and the Taub Institute for Research in Aging and Alzheimer's disease at Columbia University, New York.

Her research on cognitive test performance among African American and Hispanic elders is currently funded by the National Institute on Aging and the Alzheimer's Association. She has authored over 40 peer-reviewed publications and 6 book chapters.
